## CANNOCK CHASE COUNCIL DEVELOPER CONTRIBUTIONS AND HOUSING CHOICES SUPPLEMENTARY PLANNING DOCUMENT ADOPTION STATEMENT: JULY 2015

Notice is hereby given that Cannock Chase Council resolved to adopt the Developer Contributions and Housing Choices Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) on 8<sup>th</sup> July 2015.

The SPD sets out Cannock Chase District Council's approach to securing developer contributions from new developments. The SPD is supplementary to the adopted Local Plan (Part 1) particularly Policies CP2, CP3, CP5, CP7, CP13 and CP16. It operates alongside the Councils Community Infrastructure Levy Charging Schedule, which is effective from the 1<sup>st</sup> June 2015. The SPD replaces the former Developer Contributions SPD (2008) and Housing Choices SPD (2008), both of which are now revoked.

Modifications made to the draft SPD are set out in the accompanying 'Consultation Statement'.

Any person with sufficient interest in the decision to adopt the SPD may apply to the High Court for permission to apply for judicial review of that decision. Any such application should be made promptly and in any event no later than 3 months after the date on which the SPD was adopted (8<sup>th</sup> July 2015).
