Since 1 October 2015 it is now illegal:

For anyone to smoke in private vehicles that are carrying someone under 18

1.1 Smoking in private vehicles

Since 1 October 2015, private vehicles must be smoke-free if they are enclosed, there is more than one person present, and one of them is under 18. It is an offence:

- for a person of any age to smoke in a private vehicle that is carrying someone who is under 18
- for a driver (including a provisional driver) not to stop someone smoking in these circumstances

The rules don't apply to e-cigarettes.
