We said we would: Decrease in smoking prevalence and harm caused by alcohol

<p>Deliver Tobacco Control initiatives to local businesses in accordance with the Service Level Agreement with South Staffordshire PCT.</p> <p>All actions within the Service Level Agreement have been delivered. In particular, the Council exceeded the target for brief intervention training and the Council has attained the Breath Easy Award.</p>	
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<p>Implement the District Alcohol Harm Reduction Strategy action plan.</p> <p>A revised Staffordshire Alcohol Strategy has been produced, and more recently a new National Alcohol Strategy has been published. This requires the District Strategy and action plan to be rewritten. A revised Strategy and Action Plan will be produced in the first quarter of 2012/13.</p>	
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We said we would: Supporting vulnerable people to live in their own homes

<p>Facilitate the adaptation of the homes of people with disabilities.</p> <p>The annual target for both Council (target 95) and Privately (target 62) owned properties has been exceeded with 108 and 77 properties respectively receiving adaptations representing a</p>	
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spend of £476,791.

We said we would: Regulate local food businesses to protect Public Health

Achieve an annual increase in the number of premises broadly compliant with food safety requirements.

The slight reduction in broadly compliant premises is due to implementation in January 2011 of revised Food Standards Agency guidance on risk rating. This has resulted in a larger number of premises failing to reach compliance in the "confidence in management" criterion.



Complete the required number of food inspections each quarter.

By the end of the year, all required food inspections have been carried out in line with the programme of activity.



Number of enforcement actions undertaken.

Throughout the year, the required number of enforcement actions have been completed each quarter.



As performance measures:

Percentage of premises classes as broadly compliant with legal requirements.

93%

The broadly compliant figure is a snapshot in time, and represents the percentage of food premises judged by inspectors to be "satisfactory" on inspection.



Complete the required number of food hygiene inspections each quarter.

100%

At the end of 2011/12, all of the required food inspections had been undertaken in line with the programme of inspection.



Number of enforcement actions taken.
