<p>Implementation and embedding of Waste Management Contract:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Delivery of mobilisation plan • New branding & marketing • Food waste campaign • Consider recommendations of Scrutiny <p>The Waste and Recycling collection service was successfully transferred in April 2016 to Biffa Municipal Ltd. Quarter 3 (Oct 17) saw the start of a large scale dry recycling contamination campaign across the district; to reduce contamination, including waste, such as nappies, food, and animal bedding that was being hidden in refuse sacks and bags by some residents.</p> <p>The end of Qtr. 2 (Sept 16) saw over 12,500 warning tags being issued to residents over two collections, backed up by a local press and media campaign. During Oct 16 over 7,500 tags were issued for dry recycling contamination; the majority of which bins were not collected and residents were asked to either remove contamination, make their own arrangement or place the items in their residual waste. This has invariably increased the amount of residual waste that has been recorded for the quarter, which it should also be noted has generally increased during 2016.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Business continuity for residents • Transfer of staff • Reduced contamination loads

<p>To secure Green Flag accreditation for Hednesford Park</p> <p>An application was submitted for Hednesford Park although considerable work was still being undertaken as part of the HLF project. Unfortunately, the Council were notified in that it has not been successful this year in attaining this accreditation for Hednesford Park, primarily because there are still works to be completed. An application will be submitted for 2017-18.</p>					
<p>Explore delivery options for a new cemetery site</p> <p>Detailed capital costs and revenue costs have been ascertained for the development of the site as a new cemetery and informal discussions held with potential development partners. A report is on track for Cabinet in August 2016.</p> <p>Report was considered by Cabinet in August as scheduled. Cabinet's decision to explore options with the private sector was subject to a "Call In" which is due to be held on 3rd October.</p> <p>Cabinet's decision upheld in Quarter 3 and work will start in developing the specification and core requirements during 2017-18</p>					
<p>Environmental Improvements Programme: Proactive approach to identify areas for improvement through multi-service approach.</p> <p>A number of new style benches have been ordered for Rugeley Town Centre around the Brooke Square area to replace existing benches in poor and unsightly condition. These are due to be installed during Qtr. 4. Pedestrian area work by Staffordshire County Councils Highways Department to improve the aesthetics and utility of areas of block paving in Cannock Town Centre is due to start in during Qtr. 4 The County Council on our behalf have also approached British Telecom about removing some of the little used telephone boxes in Cannock Town Centre to improve the area and reduce anti social behaviour such as fly posting.</p>	Improved physical environment
