REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR OF GOVERNANCE

REPRESENTATIVES ON OUTSIDE BODIES – CHASE COUNCIL FOR VOLUNTARY SERVICES

1. Purpose of Report

- 1.1 To consider the appointment of representatives to the Chase Council for Voluntary Services.

2. Recommendation

- 2.1 That Council determine the appointment of a District Councillor to the Chase Council for Voluntary Services until the 2008 Annual Meeting, thereby replacing Mr. R. Turville.

3. Background

- 3.1 On 23 May 2007 Council agreed the representatives to be appointed to Outside Bodies for the 2007/08 Municipal Year. In doing so, Councillor Mrs. M.A. Davis and Mr. R. Turville were appointed as the Council's representatives to the Chase Council for Voluntary Services (CVS) until the 2008 Annual Meeting.
- 3.2 Since this meeting, the CVS have advised the Council that they wish to continue with the practice of two District Councillors being nominated to the CVS Board to serve as Directors and Trustees.

4. Details of Matters to be Considered

- 4.1 Council is requested to consider the appointment of a District Councillor to the Chase Council for Voluntary Services until the 2008 Annual Meeting, thereby replacing Mr. R. Turville.

- 5.1 The Council, through its democratic process, contributes to the each of the Council's strategic objectives, represented by the acronym CHASE.
