**7. Appointment of Chairman**

Councillor Mrs. P.A. Ansell was appointed Chairman for the meeting.

**8. Apologies and Reconstitution of Membership**

The Chairman reported that all Members of the Sub-Committee were present and that it was not necessary for a Member to be substituted by another Member taken from the membership of the full Licensing/Public Protection Committee.

**9. Application for Conversion to a Premises Licence and Simultaneously Vary the Licence at Olly's Bar, 34-36 Bow Street, Rugeley**

Consideration was given to the report of the Head of Environmental Health (Enclosure 4.1 – 4.54 of the Official Minutes of the Council).

The Officer of the Licensing Authority submitted the Council's case in respect of a conversion to a Premises Licence and simultaneously vary the application in respect of Olly's Bar, 34-36 Bow Street, Rugeley.

The objector to the application and the applicant's representative were afforded the opportunity to ask questions of the Officer of the Licensing Authority.

Following this, Members of the Sub-Committee asked questions of the Officer of the Licensing Authority.

The objector to the application put his case in the presence of the Officer of the Licensing Authority and the applicant's representative. The applicant's representative and Members of the Sub-Committee asked questions of the objector to the application.

The applicant's representative put the case in respect of the application in the presence of the Officer of the Licensing Authority and the objector. The applicant's representative reported an amendment to the application in that the exhibition of films on the ground and first floors would commence at 2000 hours and not 1100 hours on the days indicated in the application. The applicant's representative also agreed that the proof of age policy would apply to those persons who appeared to be under 21 years of age and not 18 years of age. The objector to the application and Members of the Sub-Committee asked questions of the applicant's representative.

All parties had the opportunity to summarise their cases before the Sub-Committee deliberated in private.

The Sub-Committee, having deliberated in private and having considered the application together with the representations made:-

RESOLVED:

- (A) That the application for conversion to a premises licence be approved.
- (B) That the application to simultaneously vary the licence be approved subject to:-
  - (i) the exhibition of films on the ground and first floors commencing at 2000 hours on the days indicated on the application.
  - (ii) the proof of age policy applying to those persons who appear to be under 21 years of age.
  - (iii) the operating schedule as outlined in the application being incorporated as conditions to the licence.

#### Reason for the Decision

The Sub-Committee decided to grant the licence as it considered that the application met each of the licensing objectives.
