### 1. Purpose of Report

- 1.1 To advise members of the need to reduce the amount of expenditure on Discretionary Rate Relief effective from 1st April 2009.
- 1.2 To present some options to members, as to how those savings may be made.
- 1.3 To give members the opportunity to consider any other methods by which they would wish to make those savings.

### 2. Recommendation

2.1 Members are requested to establish a framework against which applications for Discretionary Rate Relief, from rate liabilities effective from 1st April 2009, will be considered.

### 3. Conclusions and Reason(s) for the Recommendation(s)

3.1 As a result of the budget setting process, the budget available to pay for Discretionary Rate relief with effect from 1st April 2009, is to be reduced by £8,000 (approximately 30%)

### 4. Key Issues

- 4.1 Members are therefore required to review our approach to Discretionary Relief, so that the appropriate savings can be made and in order to assist with this decision, the following information is shown below:
  - A summary of our expenditure on Mandatory and Discretionary relief in 2008/09.
  - Four options as to how the savings may be achieved. These options are not exhaustive and the decision as to the amount of relief to be offered to various types of organisation, must be made by members. No Officer recommendation is made.
  - A statement of the amount of saving made by each option.

### 5.2 Mandatory Relief

- 5.2.1 The relief paid to Educational Establishments, Birth Defects Foundation, Home Farm Trust Ltd and Housing 21 is entirely mandatory. Provided that the organisations concerned continue to satisfy the statutory qualifying criteria they will continue to receive 80% relief. This is funded entirely by Central Government.
- 5.2.2 Unless members wish to consider offering top-up relief to these organisations, which would introduce a new cost to the Council, no further consideration is necessary. There is certainly no scope for achieving budgetary savings.

### 5.3 Top – Up Relief

5.3.1 This is the name given to the discretionary relief paid over and above mandatory relief, to registered charities and Community Amateur Sports Clubs. The Council bears 75% of the cost of any Top-Up Relief.

### 5.4 Discretionary Relief.

5.4.1 For the purpose of this exercise and the table above, discretionary relief means relief given to organisations other than registered charities and Community Amateur Sports Clubs. The Council bears 25% of the cost of this relief.

### 5.5 Hardship Relief

5.5.1 Members are able to award discretionary relief to organisation which are suffering severe hardship. Individual applications are always required and individual decisions will be made on those applications. Members will be required to consider the advantages of supporting profit making organisations against the interests of the Council Tax payers, as the Council will bear 25% of any hardship relief given.

### Section 2

#### 6 Details of Matters to be Considered

6.1 Members are asked to determine a new protocol against which Discretionary Relief applications will be considered. To assist with this decision, a number of options are illustrated below. Each option, if adopted would achieve the £8,000 savings. But the list is not exhaustive

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and there are a number of other ways that the savings can be achieved. Alternative options can be identified, discussed and costed at the meeting.

# Option 1 – Removal of Discretionary Relief to Non-Registered Charitable and Non-Profit Making Organisations.

This is the option that Council anticipates being adopted. The savings item that was incorporated into the Council's Budget referred specifically to a saving of £8,000 caused by the removal of Discretionary Relief to Non-Registered Charitable and Non-Profit Making Organisations. If members do not accept this option, a report to cabinet will be required.

The following table illustrates the effect of adopting this option.

### Mandatory Relief

Mandatory relief is at 80% of rates payable and is provided for in Sections 43(5) and (6) and 45(5) and (6) of the Local Government Finance Act 1988.

### **Discretionary Relief**

The authority to grant discretionary relief is provided for in Section 47 of the Local Government Finance Act 1988.

A charging authority has discretion under Section 47 to grant relief to charities in excess of 80% mandatory relief up to 100%. If relief to charities is increased above the mandatory level, Sections 43(5) and 45(5) are disapplied and the amount of relief is determined by rates determined by the Authority. It also has discretion to grant relief of up to 100% to certain non-profit making bodies.

### Hardship Relief

Section 49 of the Local Government Finance Act 1988 gives billing authorities a discretionary power to either reduce or remit occupied/unoccupied non-domestic rates. However, the authority can **only** exercise its discretion if it is satisfied on **both** of the following points:

- (a) the ratepayer would sustain hardship if the authority did not act; and
- (b) it is reasonable for the authority to do so, having regard to the interests of persons subject to its Council Tax, for example, where the employment in the area would be worsened if a company closed down.
