2	<p>MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING Minutes were agreed. Clarity was given by Alan Edwards about KPMG and the transformation. KPMG is the organisation, Transformation SP 25 is the brand.</p>	

3	<p>LPT PERFORMANCE REVIEW</p> <p>Crime figures: Sarah and Mark gave an update. Staffordshire Police crime figures are overall up by 9.6% covering the period April 2017 to Feb 2018. Cannock Chase up by 9% South Staffs up by 18% Stafford up by 16% Lichfield up by 16% Reasons for increase in Cannock Chase: Arson is up: In Cannock town centre bins. The Community Safety Partnership (C.S.P.) attended by around 20 partner organisations are trying to find out who owns the land. Two young females have been identified as suspects but there is no evidence in place yet. A Crime Prevention Survey was completed and sent to businesses owners, however they did not adopt any of the recommendations. This will be revisited with them. Violent Crime is up: Low level assaults, rape (known to victims) no stranger rapes, historical rape cases. Burglaries are down: Many current offenders are now in prison. A lot of partnership working with Integrated Offender Management (I.O.M.) has taken place, resulting in some of the most prolific offenders being rehabilitated. Historically burglaries from sheds usually start to rise in the Spring. Officers attend domestic burglaries and offer crime prevention advice and additional support for the vulnerable and elderly. Monitoring trends in ways of entering can lead to convictions. Rape case review: Will be carried out force wide and locally as necessary. Theft from motor vehicles is up Theft of motor vehicles (including motor bikes) is up. Pursuit of vehicles does not always happen for safety reasons. Drugs cases are down by 20%: Many significant drug dealers have been caught.</p>	
4	<p>LOCAL PERFORMANCE MATTERS/UPDATE SINCE LAST MEETING</p> <p>Christmas Light Switch On went well, schools were involved, licensing operation in place, rival gang trouble was stemmed by intervention from police, offenders with weapons were arrested. Section 60 allows searching someone if there is suspicion of weapons. Shoplifting Initiative yielded successful arrests. Vulnerable people had been shepherded into shops on the pretence that they were helping the offender to buy a coat for their grandparent and then stole from them. Shops, businesses and petrol stations are being encouraged to upload their CCTV footage on line directly to the police force.</p>	

	<p>Extra staff including Sarah and Mark worked nights on events night such as New Year's Eve and Black Friday</p> <p>Cross border criminals Staffordshire Police are trying to stem the criminal over flow from West Midlands i.e. organised crime groups, drugs activity, cuckooing,</p> <p>Modern Day Slavery – members of the community have been giving information to the police. A number of significant arrests have been made and investigations are ongoing across LPTs and cross border.</p> <p>Transformation will include staff changes. There will be no Deputies in the force anymore.. A Resolution Centre is planned for the Cannock Chase District in April. (desktop investigating). A Resolution Centre has been successfully piloted in Stoke on Trent.</p> <p>Knife amnesty is taking place this week.</p> <p>Domestic Violence Perpetrator Programme is imminent.</p> <p>Brereton & Ravenhill Trade Fayre is due to take place 18th Feb – police will be attending (cancelled)</p> <p>An events calendar is being populated to help to see peaks and demands.</p> <p>Social Media training is being undertaken by police staff. Smart Alert information will now be more detailed. Information is still spread to the community by other methods e.g. leaflets, community Centres, groups, email.</p>
